



Traffic Amnesty coming soon!

Beginning October 1, 2015, you may qualify to have your old, unpaid traffic fines reduced by 50% or 80% if you meet the following guidelines:

1. The fine and any related fees were due before January 1, 2013;
2. You do not have any outstanding misdemeanor or felony warrants in Colusa County;
3. You do not owe victim restitution on any case in Colusa County; and
4. You have not made any payments on your tickets since June 24, 2015.

The benefits of paying your traffic tickets through the Traffic Amnesty program include:

- Any Civil Assessments (\$300 charge added for Failure to Appear and/or Failure to Pay) will be eliminated.
- If your driver's license was suspended due to unpaid tickets, the suspension will be removed and you will be eligible to have your license reinstated.

Most people will be eligible for a 50% reduction of fines and fees. If you receive public assistance or are earning less than the federal poverty income level, you may qualify for an 80% reduction.

If you have made payments on your tickets since June 24, 2015, you may still be eligible to have your driver's license reinstated, although the amount of your fine will not be reduced.

Please note that you will have to pay a \$50 program fee for participation in the Traffic Amnesty Program.
